CYCLICAL & PLANNED MAINTENANCE



During 2015 and continuing into 2016, North and East undertook Stock Condition Surveys of your home which involved our surveyors looking at all parts of your house or apartment to assess the condition and state of repair. North and East can then plan and budget for immediate and future repair works. This information tells us the condition of our stock it also allows us to plan for future works like replacement kitchens, bathrooms, windows, doors etc. so that your home is maintained to the highest possible standard. A notification letter will be sent to all tenant notifying them if works are planned in their area.

ANNUAL BOILER SERVICING

North and East as your landlord are carrying out boiler and heating inspections in your home.

The boiler servicing commenced on 4th April and you will receive a letter to specify when the engineer will be in your area. The contractor will then contact you with an estimated time of arrival.





North and East's annual gas and oil boiler servicing contract has been awarded to On The Level Ltd. It is vitally important that you let our contractors into your home to carry out the safety check. It should take approximately one hour for the engineer to service your boiler. We appreciate your co operation here. The contractor will be fitting CO detectors and other safety equipment.

As part of the boiler servicing contract, North and East will be upgrading the controls of your heating system to make it user friendly and more efficient to use. Refer to www.climote.ie for further information on how the heating control works. The contractor will give you a full demonstration on how to programme your new *climote* heating control.

also based in our head office.


orth & East is delighted to congratulate our tenant Rex Lee on the publication of his memoirs "Melodies at Eventide – an Irish memoir about overcoming disability." Housing Officer Jackie Knight attended the launch in Kells library and described it as a very joyous uplifting occasion.

Rex's book is a personal account disability, never allowing it to limit his outlook or narrow his horizons. His story is also the story of Ireland as a country striving to assert itself on the world stage, overcoming barriers and obstacles that history had put in the way. His account spans much of period following Independence. Through his own involvement and activism (including work with organisations such as Macra na Feirme and both witnessed and played a part in the making and shaping of the down to us today.

Reading through Rex's memoirs we are reminded of the lines Seamus Heaney wrote for his brother who had his own struggle with disability

"My dear brother, you have good stamina. You stay on where it happens... you keep old roads open by driving on the new ones."
