Paying your rent

Rent is charged on a weekly basis beginning on Monday and is payable in advance. This means that all payments must be made by the end of the previous week. You currently have 3 ways to pay your rent.

- 1. Household Budget: Tenants who receive their welfare payments through the post office can have their rent deducted from their weekly payment.
- 2. Standing Order: You can set up a standing order in your bank, building society or credit union.
- 3. Bank Lodgement Book: We will issue you with a lodgement book, which you can use to pay your rent at the bank or post office.

Please use your name and account number on ALL lodgements.

Sports days were held in Ardmore and McArdle Green over the summer. Great fun was had by all children who participated in racing, skipping and the ever popular parachute game.




We even had time for a sit down and some well-deserved treats!



Gas Boiler Troubleshooting

We understand how frustrating it is when things go wrong in your home. There are often issues that can be resolved quickly, therefore, if you have a gas boiler issue, it is important that you carry out some simple checks.

Check the gas supply

 If you have a gas cooker, check that it's working. Check with your neighbour, do they have any issues?

If you have a pay as you go meter, check that you have credit.

If you have run out of credit, please check that your display indicates ON (refer to photograph below). If yes, follow instructions below:



- 1. Put money/credit on the card
- 2. Insert the card into the meter
- 3. Press the reset button on the boiler.
- If you have run out of credit and the display indicated OFF, follow instructions below:
- 1. Put money/credit on the card
- 2. Insert the card into the meter
- Press & hold red button (A) for approx. 30 seconds until you hear a pressure release sound and the display indicates ON
- 4. Press the reset button on the boiler.

When you run out of credit, you starve your boiler of gas and it may take several attempts to reset and reignite the pilot light.

Check the power supply

 Your boiler has a power supply situated close to the boiler. Is the red light on?

Check the boiler pressure

The typical pressure range is 1.5 –
 2 bar. If the boiler falls below

this, it may require a top up and may indicate a leak somewhere in the system.

Check the time clock

The time clock allows you to run the central heating and/or hot water, or both. You can set the times so they come on automatically, or you can use the time clock to turn them on and off yourself.

Check the wall thermostat

 You will usually find wall thermostats in your living room and/or landing area. A typical temperature range is between 18

 23 degrees. When your home reaches the set temperature, the boiler will turn off. If the temperature is set too low, the boiler may not kick in as your home may be already at temperature. In the colder weather, you may find a higher temperature suits you better.

Check Thermostatic valves on radiators

 The radiator valves allow you control the temperature of each room.
 Check that the valves are open, 0 is closed and 5 is open fully. The typical setting would be 3 – 4.
